Any answer that has patient confused or restless is most likely the correct answer.

How to answer Priority Questions on the NCLEX? - NCLEX ...

There are 3 principles that you should always consider when answering prioritization questions: The first is the ABC's, meaning airway, breathing, circulation. Always use the ABC principle first. Making sure the patient has a clear airway should always be your top priority.

7 Strategies To Answer NCLEX® Style Questions Right In ...

The priority victim is the one who must be treated immediately or life, limb, or vision will be threatened. This victim is categorized as emergent (option 2). The victim who requires treatment, but life, limb, or vision is not threatened if care can be provided within 1 to 2 hours is considered urgent and is the second priority (option 3).

Once you have identified the key word, it will help you focus on what exactly the question wants you to answer. – Repeated words. The same words may appear in the NCLEX question and in the correct answer. It may be the same word or a synonym of the word. This strategy can help you identify correct answer choices. – Odd answers

When answering NCLEX RN priority questions, one factor you should keep in mind is Maslow's hierarchy of needs. It tells about the five levels of human needs - physiological needs, safety and security, love and belonging, self-esteem and self-actualization (ranked from the most important to the least important.)
