Principles of Modern Modal Counterpoint 1. Writing within a mode or scale. In this style of counterpoint, one stays almost exclusively within one mode or chosen scale. Accidentals are introduced in a very formal way, either to emphasize a cadence or as part of an intentional extended tonality technique.

What's the difference between modal and tonal counterpoint ...

Modal counterpoint is an ancient art, first developed in the 12th and 13th Centuries and flourished in Europe through the period of Medieval and Renaissance music, eventually giving way to the system of tonality, tonal counterpoint and functional harmony that will be the focus for the remainder of the semester.

IOW, rather than "jumping back in time" to the 16th century and then moving chronologically forwards, you just move backwards through time - you may already have a handle on Classical Tonal Harmony, so Baroque (Tonal) Counterpoint moves that a step back in time to some degree, then Renaissance (Modal) Counterpoint goes another step (or 3 or 4 :-) back.
